Lovell is a leading provider of partnership and open-market housing with expertise in housing-led regeneration including new-build, open market housing, refurbishment, planned maintenance and assisted living across. Working across England, Wales, and Scotland the business has a market share in excess of £½billion annually and is recognised throughout UK construction for its efforts to improve sustainability. Along with its parent company, Morgan Sindall Group, Lovell has been a key supporter of The Pallet LOOP since its inception and was among the first signatories of The Pallet LOOP Charter.

THE OPPORTUNITY

These pallets cost the business a significant amount to dispose of, largely in segregated or mixed waste skips. Recognising The Pallet LOOP provides a better way to manage pallets, Lovell has initiated pallet collections from various sites across the UK.

THE APPROACH

The Pallet LOOP's fixed price collection service, which includes the collection of branded and unbranded white pallets, provides principal contractors and housebuilders with a clear understanding of the pallet disposal costs associated with each project. This is in stark contrast to other collection and waste services.

Using the scheme provides major cost savings with collections from The Pallet LOOP working out, on average, half the cost of disposal by skip. Additional benefits of The Pallet LOOP scheme, include:

- Fast, efficient collection of pallets (within 72 hrs), with no minimum collection quantity
- Reduced overall waste quantities (up to 10%)
- Less clutter on site – improving health and safety.

THE RESULTS

The Pallet LOOP has now picked up several thousand single use white pallets from ten different Lovell sites nationwide. Pallets are returned to one of The Pallet LOOP's many repair hubs dotted across the country. Where possible, pallets are refurbished and sold back into the reconditioned pallet market, with any waste sent for recycling into chipboard, animal bedding or biomass. The Pallet LOOP estimates this new way of working has so far saved Lovell more than £11,000 in waste disposal costs. Lovell is now eagerly waiting for The Pallet LOOP's green re-useable pallets to enter the building materials supply chain.
